Playwright's Note, by Thom Dunn

Comic books are so in voque. Yeah, I said it. With Marvel's The Avengers ranking as the third highest grossing film of all time (hev remember 4 months ago when Joss Whedon was just "That guy who made Buffy and a bunch of other shows that got cancelled?") and The Dark Knight Rises looming overhead, what was once deemed as "nerd culture" now seems to rule everything around us. But even though this culture tends to focus its collective attention on the big-budget Hollywood blockbusters, I've always found more common ground between comic books and theatre. All three are visual mediums, sure. but comic books and theatre both tend to be driven by the literature and then transformed into something more fantastical and sensory. Even comic book conventions are inherently theatrical—comic creators perform on a stage in front of an audience during the forums, and of course, there's the costumes. People might associate masks with superheroes now, but there is a longstanding tradition of mask work in theatre that far pre-dates Batman (or the Internet, for that matter). And really, what's the difference between the stock characters of Commedia dell'arte and the pantheon of super characters owned by Marvel and DC?

In writing this play, I hoped to create a relatable, human story about relationships, passion, ambition, and creation -- one that just so happened to be set over a weekend at a comic book convention. As ridiculous as that goal might sound, none of it would have been even remotely possible without the awesome folks at Vagabond Theatre Group and Bazaar Productions at the Berkshire Fringe Festival (where I workshopped the play in 2011). Vagabond Artistic Director James "Not Jim. Never Jim" Peter Sotis has had such a firm understanding of this play that he often enlightens me to details in the script that I didn't even realize I had written, and he's taken those moments and built upon them to create something better. Laura Maria Censabella, my fantastic playwright mentor at the Berkshire Fringe Festival, may not have had any idea who Han Solo is (yes, seriously), but she knew that there was a strong cast of living, breathing characters on these pages, amongst all my nerdy kitsch vagary, and she believed in me enough to help me find them.

And finally, I'd like to dedicate this production to Mike, Starring, Mama Cooter, Crystal, and anyone else who couldn't be here, because you were exactly the kind of people who inspired me to make this thing happen.

So anyway, thanks for indulging my fanboy obsessions and general geekery, and I hope you enjoy the ride. It's a lot cheaper than a plane to San Diego and a hotel room for the week.

Director's Note, by James Peter Sotis

I think the experiment worked.

True Believers is the result of a new approach VTG is taking to theatre. We realized some time ago that its not those few nights on stage that make us love theatre, but the whole dirty process—everything from the readthrough to set strike.

If we could get people to come along and enjoy the ride, then the destination could be anywhere. Comedyland. Dramaville. New Worksylvania. We wouldn't have to sacrifice what kinds of theatre we did for the sake of a hook or marketing tool. And if we wanted our audience to join us, we figured we should start at the beginning. So we opened up the development process and took a chance.

And thus There Will Be Words was born. This is when it all started to get real. We opened submissions and, wouldn't you know it, a cheeky little play called *True Believers* fell into our lap. It was right up our alley, every joke landing and every little pause hitting close to home. There was no play more perfect to run this gamble with than one as near and dear to our hearts as True Believers.

We assembled a crackerjack cast, and the TWBW reading was a success. We keept going. We took that cast and performed at Improv Boston's Geek Week. It was a blast. We kept going. We grabbed a few new people along the way, and here we are.

Over the past few months of this endeavor, I've come to see a whole lot of VTG in the characters of *True Believers*. There's Chad, who wants to write comics his way, but can't quite gain his footing. Calvin, who wants desperately to spend his life doing what he loves. There's KT, who is awesome at doing both of those. The problems of Ted, Billy, Chloe, and Box all have reflections in what we've been trying to do here. It's rather wonderful, in a meta kind of way.

What True Believers has become amazes me. We have computer animated sequences and film clips. We have great performances. We have a robot. This whole thing is a sandbox, and I'm overjoyed that everyone came out to play.

I reserve a special shout out to the brilliant, talented, and prophetic Thom Dunn, who allowed us to play with his words, and who went above and beyond to see this thing through to the end. Thanks are more than due to the cast and crew—old and new—for bringing this thing to life. True Believers came from everyone in this program. It's all possible thanks to their talent, drive, and passion.


Josh Friedensohn (Technical Director, Scenic Design/Construction, Props)




